## **PENTECOST AND THE FAITHFUL**

Dear Faithful,

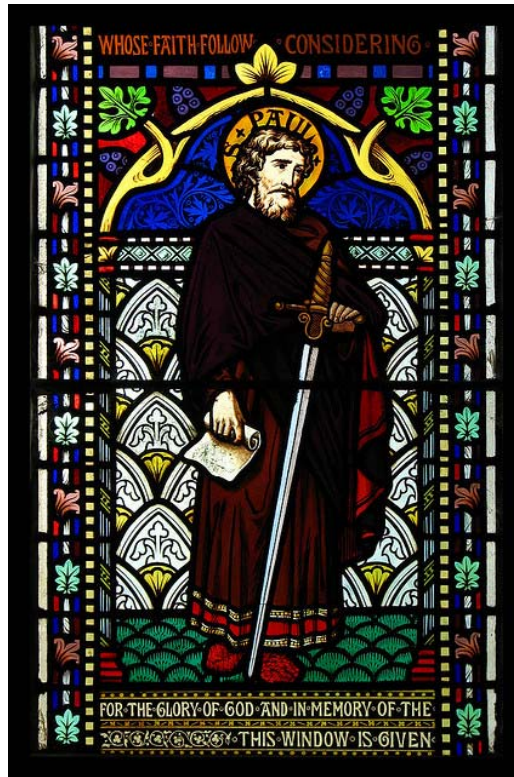
This is the time of year when we celebrate, with the Apostles, together with the Blessed Virgin, experiencing the fulfillment of our Lord's promise, that they would receive Power from Heaven. They received that promise, the Power that penetrated their very being. All experienced this power through their senses: they heard what was like a storm from Heaven, a powerful wind, as it were, that shook the house; and also with their eyes, what seemed tongues of fire descending on everyone without exception.

But it was more, they spoke in languages they never learned and others, who heard them, recognized their own native speech. As the Apostles left the house, other people who were in Jerusalem from all parts of the Roman Empire and spoke only their own local language, were amazed to realize that the Apostles, who were known to be from Galilee, were speaking not Galilean, but their own respective languages.

All in the crowd recognized God's magnificent power overtaking them. Thousands were convicted by their conscience, reminding them that they offended God for condemning Jesus to death. They asked Peter what they must now do. Peter told them: repent and be washed clean by the water of Baptism. That day 3,000 became followers of Jesus, whom, days before, they put to death.

What Power of Grace moved among them! How God changed the hearts of stubborn sinners! The Apostles truly experienced the Power that changed them from doubting, fearful men into exuberant joyful, enthusiastic witnesses of Jesus. Thus the New Way was born, the Church Christ promised to build

on Peter, became a new force on earth. Faith was given to the Apostles, Faith, which is God's Power in the soul of men. But Our Lord taught them for 3 years and now all their learning was fired up with God's gift of Grace, and understanding: they were anointed by the power of the Holy Spirit of God! It serves us well to reflect on what took place, and the meaning of Jesus' promise.



St. Paul whom Jesus converted later, reflected on what he learned from the Apostles. He said that the Apostles became members of God's very household. In other words, the gift of the God's Holy Spirit, Who was in Christ, now was given to the Apostles. St. Paul urged his own Christian converts to have in them the mind and the Spirit of Christ. This is possible through God's desire of men's salvation.

Our Lord himself says in the Gospel, "If any one loves Me, the Father Himself will love him and both He and the Son will come into his soul and we will make our abode with him." This is stunning news.

As God lives in Jesus, so does He in the soul, who loves Christ and obeys Him.

So it is critical to love and obey Christ! Both of these powers, love and obedience in the soul, start with faith; this choice we can make with God's grace knocking at our door. Think of it! Our miserable human life can change into heaven when God abides in our souls!

How critical this Faith of ours, and how so many belittle it, fail to cultivate it, fail to expand it, to know its teachings and the truth. Jesus came and

taught poor, simple fishermen, all sinners without God. No wonder St. John tell us that it is our Faith that conquers the world, sin, darkness, and hopelessness! And God desires to lift us to himself!

Great is Our God and unsurpassable His love for each of us! Pentecost is God's entry into the souls of believers. Pentecost is Jesus' promise fulfilled! Pentecost is God's love given to the souls of men, when sinners become God's own children, no different from Jesus, except our clinging to our sins. So few of us want to give up our sins and make room for God living in us.

Remember, Jesus is asking us to love him, and he also spells it out without mincing words, nor is He hiding the source of His Power. He tells us that the proof for one's love for Him is in our obeying His Word, His teaching. His Word is Spirit and Life, Which is God himself. What Power is given us and how few are willing to heed it.

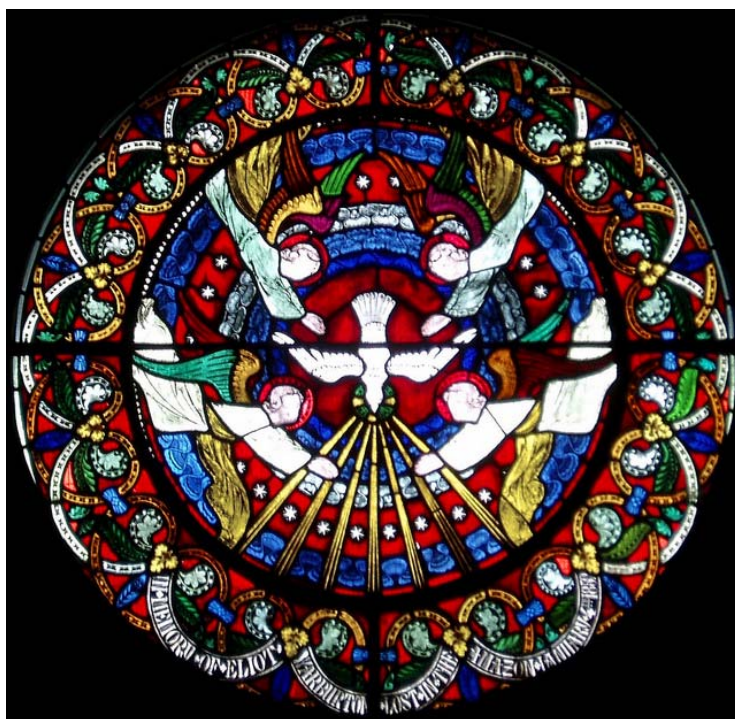
Dear Faithful, imitate St. Paul who also was a sinner but then he repented, he obeyed Christ because he recognized the love Christ had for him. Pentecost is the birthday of the Church. The Church is Jesus Christ Himself, with us clinging to Him. Jesus says, Anyone, who comes to me, I will not only not reject him, but my Father will love him also". As much as you want to love Jesus Christ, Whom the Father gave to us, so much more did the Father love the world, so that anyone who chooses to believe in Him and take His calling you to heart, you will not be lost, but will be saved.

Pentecost can be your birthday now in Heaven. Make it a celebration. God desires to celebrate it with you because He loves you. Give up your sins and weaknesses and love your God in place of your sins.

Today's Muslims are crowding in because Catholics cower and give up their Faith or only pay lip service to their faith. They have forgotten how to defend their faith because their own faith is weak. Rise up! Christ suffered immeasurable pain, degradations, and humiliations to make sure that each of us had the opportunity to spend eternity with him in heaven. ## A PRACTICAL CATHOLIC

The sole condition for membership in the Order of Knights of Columbus is that an applicant or member be a practical or practicing Catholic over 18 years old in union with the Holy See. In other words, he must be a Catholic in good standing in the Catholic Church. The main component elements of this requirement may be briefly described as follows:

1. To reflect Christ in the modern world, in all circumstances and places of living. That is, to order one's life according to the teachings of Christ and to follow the pattern of His example.
2. To show love and loyalty for the Church, and to defend the Church, her teachings and her representatives in all attacks against them. (Helping one's bishop and parish priest is the primary way to do this). To accept the teaching authority of the Church on matters of faith and morals, aspires to live in accord with the precepts of the holy Catholic Church, and is in good standing in the Catholic Church.
3. To accept and respect the Church's authority (vested in the Supreme Pontiff and the Hierarchy and clergy united with him), to teach, govern and sanctify the faithful. This implies the acceptance of all the Church's teachings as proposed for our belief by the Teaching Authority of the Church.
4. To assist faithfully and intelligently at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. (Assistance at Daily Mass is highly commendable).
5. To receive Holy Communion during the Easter Time, according to precept, but frequently, at least monthly, as a good and wholesome spiritual practice.
6. To confess one's sins at least once a year, and even frequently, as a good spiritual practice, but not by command, unless confession is needed in order to free one's conscience of grave sin.
7. To fast and abstain on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by obligation imposed by the Church; to abstain on the other Fridays of Lent also by obligation imposed by the Church.

(It is strongly recommended to abstain from meat on all the other Fridays of the year, fast during Lent and perform other penitential works because of our love for Christ Who died for us on a Friday and Who fasted 40 days and nights, and because of the necessity of doing penance for our sins).

8. To give financial and moral support to the Church for her needs and programs: promoting her spiritual and sociological missions, aiding the poor and underprivileged, espousing and advancing the just cause of minority groups, etc. Endeavors to eliminate unjust discrimination, prejudice, etc.; supporting the Church in her defense of marriage and family life and in her crusades against divorce, abortion, pornography and all the evils of today.
9. To pray frequently. (It is very helpful to know and to recite the Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary, the Acts of Faith, Hope, Charity, Contrition, etc.)
10. To be a faithful and devoted husband and father, if the member is a married man; married or unmarried, to be an exemplary Catholic gentleman and a dutiful patriotic citizen.
11. If a Catholic marries outside of the Church, that is, contrary to the laws of the Church, he ceases to be a practical Catholic and hence may not be a member of the Knights of Columbus. A man who, living in a valid marriage, obtains a civil divorce and remarries outside the Church ceases to be a practical Catholic and hence loses his right to join or continue in the Order of the Knights of Columbus. If his former marriage is declared null by the Church and he remarries validly according to the Church's laws, he may be reinstated into the Order.
12. A Catholic who is a member of a forbidden, secret society is not a practical Catholic and hence may not become or continue to be a member of the Knights of Columbus.

After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a Committee of Five, with Thomas Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the wording of the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4.

# Vatican Unexpectedly Ends Takeover of US Nun Group

VATICAN CITY — The Vatican on Thursday unexpectedly ended its controversial takeover of the main umbrella group of U.S. nuns, signaling a major shift in tone and treatment of U.S. sisters under the social justice-minded Pope Francis.

The Vatican said it had accepted a final report on its overhaul of the Leadership Conference of Women Religious and declared that the "implementation of the mandate has been accomplished."

When the Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith took over the LCWR in 2012, it accused the group of taking positions that undermined Catholic teaching on the priesthood and homosexuality while promoting "certain radical feminist themes incompatible with the Catholic faith."

It envisioned a five-year overhaul to fix a "grave" doctrinal crisis, fueled by concerns among U.S. conservatives that the group had strayed from church teaching by not focusing enough on issues like abortion and euthanasia. The Vatican appointed a bishop to oversee rewriting the statutes of the LCWR, which represents 80 percent of the 57,000 Roman Catholic nuns in the U.S., reviewing all its plans and programs — including approving speakers — and ensuring the organization properly followed Catholic prayer and ritual.

In a final joint report, the congregation and the LCWR said the group's new statutes show its focus on Christ and being faithful to church teaching. It said an advisory committee would be created to ensure manuscripts in LCWR publications are doctrinally sound. It said speakers at LCWR events must use the "ecclesial language of faith" in their remarks and said there was a revised process for selecting award winners.

"Alleluia!" tweeted Sister Mary Ann Hinsdale, a theologian at Boston College and member of the Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. "LCWR investigation by CDF is over!"

The Vatican takeover, combined with a separate Vatican investigation into the quality of life of U.S. nuns, had deeply wounded the U.S. sisters who oversee the lion's share of the Catholic Church's social programs, running schools, hospitals, homeless shelters and soup kitchens. The crackdown resulted in a remarkable outpouring of popular support for their work and fueled allegations of the church's heavy-handed, misogynistic treatment of women.

In December, the Vatican's quality of life investigation ended with sweeping praise for the sisters for their selfless work caring for the poor. Thursday's conclusion of the doctrinal assessment signaled a similar positive conclusion.

Christopher Bellitto, a church historian at Kean University in New Jersey, said the announcement Thursday was "a complete vindication" of the sisters' group and American nuns in general.

"Anything coming out of the Vatican this morning is nothing other than a fig leaf because they can't say 'oops' in Latin," Bellitto said.

After presenting the final report to the congregation's prefect, Cardinal Gerhard Mueller, a delegation of LCWR officials met with Francis and discussed his "Joy of the Gospel" apostolic exhortation, which lays out much of his vision of a church that is merciful and looks out for the poorest. While insisting on a message of mercy over morals, Francis has also frequently dismissed legalistic and theological arguments that he says can impede the church's evangelizing mission.

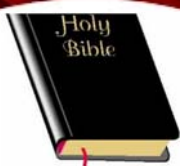
"Our conversation allowed us to personally thank Pope Francis for providing leadership and a vision that has captivated our hearts and emboldened us as in our own mission and service to the church," the LCWR said in a statement. "We were also deeply heartened by Pope Francis' expression of appreciation for the witness given by Catholic sisters through our lives and ministry and will bring that message back to our members."

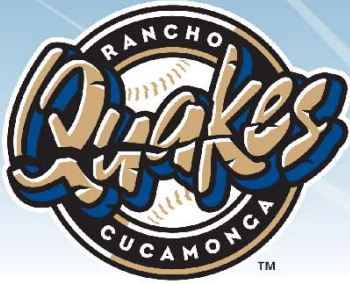
